Viva Rodeo

This spring, Spanish porcelain manufacturer **Lladró**, a 20-year fixture on Rodeo Drive, relocated to Via Rodeo, the fittingly European passage that's also home to Versace and Lanvin. Jaime Hayón, Lladró's artistic director, designed the new space, which is all white walls and sleek displays. Once synonymous with delicate figurines, Lladró now produces contemporary artworks (Paul Smith and artist Gary Baseman have collaborated) alongside functional items like mirrors and lighting. One dazzling addition is the Winter Palace chandelier (\$9,000 to \$32,600), inspired by the snow-covered palaces of the Russian tsars and made from pieces of handmade porcelain. "In such a complex world in which everything is quickly forgotten, time and experience take on vital importance," says President Rosa Lladró. Some things never go out of style.

Opening late summer, French furniture brand **Ligne Roset** will debut a glossy new boutique in San Diego's upscale La Jolla neighborhood, with a design that pulls inspiration from its coastal setting. Think ocean hues, warm woods, crisp whites and tropical reds from established lines like Prado and Togo, as well as up-and-coming names. Equally impressive is the building itself, a nearly 10,000-square-foot space that once housed the '40s-era art-moderne Cove Theatre and now boasts 14-foot-high ceilings and a grand central skylight.
