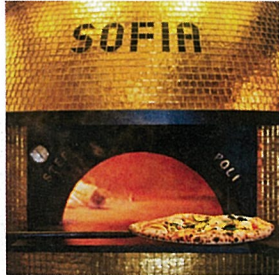




SAN DIEGO'S ENDLESS SUMMER

FRESH and NEW

With nearly 30 local purveyors, the just-opened **Liberty Public Market** is a microcosm of San Diego's food world—and its sole restaurant, **Mess Hall**, is a microcosm of the market. Every day, chef Tim Kolanko roams the stalls and then riffs on ingredients that catch his eye. Say, sea trout. Kolanko once served a potato pancake inspired by the ones his Polish grandmother made, but upgraded it with a sea trout crudo, trout roe, and lemon purée.
